Math & Science Academic Clubs

Math Club– Participate in the Wisconsin Mathematics League and Continental Math League annual statewide competitions.

SMART Teams - Students Modeling a Research Topic is a Club for students who have a strong interest in science. We team with a scientist and learn about the structure and function of one protein throughout the school year.

Public Speaking/Performance/World Languages

Forensics - Students gain confidence, improve skills, enhance their resumes and have fun competing in invitational meets against schools from all over Wisconsin as they prepare for the state qualifying sequence.

French Club - Open to all students to explore the French culture through food, games and interactive activities.

Model UN - The Model UN club spends the fall & winter preparing for the Wisconsin Model UN conference that is held each spring as a two day event where students take part in a mock governmental procedure.

Theater - Annual productions include: Fall Play, Spring Musical. This is open to all students to be performers, technician crew, or stage crew.

Student Leadership

Class Officers - Elected annually, five representatives from each class plan class specific events, such as homecoming, winter formal, and prom, class rings, village days, fundraisers, etc.

Educators Rising - Club for students who want to explore the teaching profession. We connect with educators in practice and explore issues and challenges faced in the field.

National Honor Society - Students with at least a 3.5 GPA after three semesters at GHS are invited to learn more about membership in this organization.

Competitive Business Activities & Clubs

FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America) - national organization that focuses on the development of business skills in the area of Entrepreneurship, Business Law, Public Speaking and Career Development.

School Store - Student-driven business, provides a real world, hands-on retail environment for students to gain business, marketing & finance skills. All proceeds go back into the store for repurchasing of inventory and FBLA club.



Student Engagement/School Climate

Birthday Card Club - Creating personalized birthday cards for all students and staff to make our community more welcoming.

Buddy Club - Friendship club, dedicated to enhancing lives of individuals with disabilities, pairing them with other students, working in recreation or service.

Tea Club - The purpose of this club is to sip tea, while relaxing and unwinding.

USA [United Student Alliance] - Student organization, focused on diversity, and positive understanding of culture, while welcoming all students.

Volunteer Club - Student organization focused on volunteer opportunities throughout the community and Southeastern Wisconsin.

(Gallery Night, Studio Crawl) and service activities (After School Art Program. Hope House Christmas ornaments, murals).

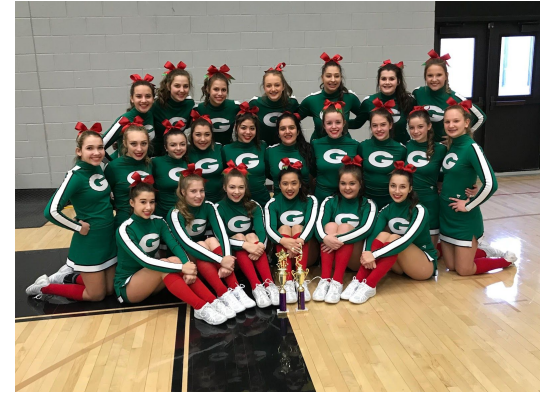
Intramural Sports (Winter/Spring)

1. Complete and sign a physical/participation form:
Current physical examination taken **April 1, 2019 and thereafter** is valid for the 2020-21 school year. Any physical taken **before April 1, 2019** is **NOT valid for the 2020-21 school year** and your child will need a new physical before tryouts begin. Parent's permission every year.
2. Pay a participation fee, subject to increase every year, prior to participation.
3. Have zero failing grades in the most recent grading period (term), and obey the Co-Curricular Code and WIAA regulations.
4. Plan to Attend the Parent & Student-Athlete Sports Meetings held before the Fall, Winter and Spring Athletics seasons.
